

Name a road on the Tweed Valley Hospital campus

Leave a lasting legacy on the new Tweed Valley Hospital campus! We are inviting staff and the community to name the six internal roads on the hospital campus.

INTERNAL CAMPUS ROADS TO BE NAMED

Refer to the corresponding number on the campus map below

1. Hospital Boulevard	Public access, runs along the front of the hospital campus adjacent to Cudgen Road
2. Service road (ring road)	Service vehicles and staff only, runs around the back of the campus. Accessed via slip lane from Cudgen Road and connecting to the Turnock Street roundabout
3. Mental Health access road	Service vehicles only, provides discreet access for secure patient transfer to the mental health unit
4. Transit lounge access road	Service vehicles only, provides access for patients arriving or leaving the hospital via patient transport vehicles.
5. Slip lane to Health Hub	Slip lane from Cudgen Road to the Health Hub and eastern end of the campus
6. Ambulance Station access road	Service and staff vehicles only, providing internal access to the Kingscliff Ambulance Station that is collocated on the campus



THE FINE PRINT

Names put forward by staff and the community will be presented to the Tweed Valley Hospital's key community forums (the Community Reference Panel and the Aboriginal Community Working Group) for shortlisting.

The shortlist will then be provided to the Northern NSW Local Health District for final selection and endorsement. Please note that the Local Health District's decision is final, and no further discussion will be entered into.

GUIDELINES

Tweed Shire Council provides a guide for the naming of roads (refer *Naming of Streets and Roads policy, version 1.3, 15 February 2018*), which will be adopted for the naming of roads on the Tweed Valley Hospital campus.

The policy includes the following guidelines:

- Name duplication is to be avoided
- Preferred sources for names:
 - i) Aboriginal names
 - ii) Local history
 - iii) Early explorers, pioneers, settlers and other eminent persons
 - iv) War/casualty lists
 - v) Thematic names such as flora, fauna and ships
- Appropriate to the physical, historical or cultural character of the area
- The origin of each name should be clearly stated and recorded
- The Local Aboriginal Land Council should be consulted when choosing Aboriginal names
- Names of living people should not be used
- Names which are offensive, incongruous or commercial/company should not be used
- No more than 40 characters including space and road type
- Easy to read, spell and pronounce
- No apostrophes, dashes, hyphens etc
- No numbers or roman numerals

Provide your road name suggestions by 29 September 2023.
